## B. GRAMMAR

1. Verbs
2. Prepositions
3. Adjectives/adverbs and what they refer to (noun/verb)
4. Pronouns

### 1. Verbs

When you have identified a verb. Make a note of the tense, if it's active or passive; identify what subject/object the verb refers to; identify what is implied in the tense (what time it refers to, if it implies a permanent, general or habitual action or a temporary one, etc.)

### 2. prepositions

Once you have identified the prepositions, note down what category it refers to:

- a. place/motion
- b. Noun-adjective-verb specific
- c. Part of a phrasal verb

### 3. Adjectives/adverbs

Identify nouns and verbs and the words preceding them that act as adjectives and adverbs describing them.

4. And finally, note down what each pronoun refers to and if it is a subject pronoun, object pronoun or possessive pronoun:
